gemaal en is dan na die kan toe.

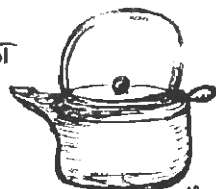
Oupa Marie het een eetlepelstjie koffie vir elke koppie
